

What is ARTPrenticeship?

- Creative Waco Program, launched 2018
- 98 young artists, 34 professional artist mentors
- 10 murals, 3 exhibitions, 5 short films
- Paid work experience & professional mentoring
- Apprentices learn how to manage a creative project from concept to completion
- Partner with schools, businesses & community
- Alumni are equipped for higher education, skilled work, and creative entrepreneurship while contributing to our community

Design Goals

- A welcoming and engaging space that invites guests to explore
- Art that moves the eye across the entire space and highlights the resident penguins
- A reflection of the origins of these Cape penguins that are native to South Africa
- The art should help guests feel welcome to stay and enjoy shaded spaces and areas for gathering
- Mural work and decor should be unique, but sensitive to visual standards of Cameron Park Zoo
- Bold, vibrant color and pattern

Creative Waco's ARTPrenticeship is delighted to partner with Cameron Park Zoo to create mural work for the new Penguin Shores habitat. This piece will compliment the existing color palettes and branding standards of the zoo, and take into consideration the natural environment of the space and colors that are established in the new construction. ARTPrenticeship mentors and apprentices will collaborate to co-design this project that includes: two flat murals on access gates, two rondavels, and thirteen wooden poles around the space.

As communicated by the Cameron Park Zoo and stakeholders, the existing architectural renderings with boldly colored patterns reflecting the South African tradition of decorative house painting on earthen homes or huts is our strongest design cue. The apprentices and mentors will take this as inspiration in cultivating their own patterns that reflect the origins of the South African penguins taking residence in this exhibit.



Timeline

- May 10-25: Design process and review
- May 27-31: Safety training and prep
- June 4: City council presentation for approval
- June 5-28: Mural execution
- During July, apprentices will execute two complementary projects:
 - Collaborative art exhibition
 - Textile design guided and produced by Will Suarez, Sendero Provisions Co.
- Apprentice exit interviews & payday July 20
- Mural wrap celebration after Penguin Shores exhibit is open, based on the zoo calendar

Investment

Mural & Program Cost: \$95,000

Revenue:

- \$45,000 National Endowment for the Arts
- \$20,000 Rapoport Foundation
- \$10,000 Cameron Park Zoological & Botanical Society
- \$20,000 Project philanthropy

No funds are requested from City of Waco


