PURPOSE



Purpose

- May 8, 2024, City Council received a presentation on Waco Convention Center Operational Model, staff committed to returning to City Council to provide an update on the process and review recommendations.
- GOAL: To explore a private management model for the Waco Convention Center, and maintain the Visitors Bureau under public-managed governance, that aligns with the goals of maximizing operational efficiency, increasing revenue, and enhancing the national profile of the Waco Convention Center.



Purpose

Why are we doing this?

- Convention Centers are highly significant economic impact generators
- Operate in a competitive industry that requires a high degree of flexibility
- WCC occupancy rate has maintained less than 40% year over year standard 70%
- Maximize revenues, reduce expenses, and stay nimble within market
- National purchasing power, opportunity costs, and national corporate partnerships
- Connections to the national landscape of the industry and pulse on key trends
- Opportunity to grow the industry image of the center
- Ensure a balance of non-local booking requirements and maintaining local use (must be a facility primarily used to host conventions & meetings that directly promote tourism and hotel industry)
- Consultant managing downtown market study highly recommended exploring
- Food and Beverage program opportunity
 - Identified in 2017 in JLL report
 - Struggled to develop



BACKGROUND



Background

- Waco Convention Center (WCC) Opened in January 1972
- Convention & Visitor Bureau (CVB) established in 1983
- Current Operating Model: Public Managed Governance
- September 2015, City engaged Jones Lang LaSalle (JLL) on behalf of WCC & CVB
 - Assess the marketing and operational effectiveness
 - Review and recommend new governance model
- August 2017, JLL delivered final report recommending WCC &
 CVB transition to Independent Non-Profit Authority
- City decided to pause on the recommended transition
- Organizational model discussion resumed 2022



Background

- May 8, 2024, staff presented to City Council during the budget retreat focusing on operational model review, industry benchmarks, and the following recommendations:
 - Launch Request for Proposals (RFP) for private management of the Waco Convention Center
 - Explore proposals and select preferred vendor
 - Develop and negotiate a qualified management contract
 - Maintain CVB in-house
 - Explore merging tourism and economic development
 - Rebrand CVB to a Destination Management Organization (DMO)
 - May 2024 September 2024:
 - o Immediately communicated and worked with staff of the WCC and CVB
 - Launched the Employee Success Team
 - Launched and completed the RFP process
 - Selected preferred vendor and engaged contract negotiations



Background

Where we are today:

- Under contract negotiations with the top proposer from the RFP process
 - Contract tentatively scheduled for City Council Consideration at the October 1, 2024 meeting
- Employee success team actively working with staff
- Transitioning Visitor Bureau functions into Economic Development Department
 - Forming the Department of Economic Development & Tourism
 - Rebranding the CVB to DMO



PROJECT STATUS



Project Status-RFP

- Launched RFP on May 16, 2024, opened for four weeks
- Four RFP submissions were received June 14, 2024
- The scoring team consisted of members from CMO, Finance, Economic Development, HR, and Convention Center
- The two top scoring firms were interviewed August 8, 2024
- Based on RFP and interview scoring, a preferred vendor was selected, and Contract negotiations are underway



Project Status-Employees

- Employee Success Team was formed immediately following announcement to staff on May 7, 2024
- Goals of Success Team are to support employees impacted by the change and help to ease transition
- Multiple rounds of one-on-one meetings allowed each employee an open discussion on available options
- Monthly luncheons began in June and will continue through the end of the transition; bring together entire team, including CMO, HR, WCC, & CVB



Project Status-Employees

- 12 employees directly affected by the possible transition
- 30+ individual meetings to date in addition to monthly luncheons
- Employee options include:
 - 1. Redeploy with the City to a vacant role in a different department via management-directed transfer
 - 2. Explore career options with the private management firm this will occur after the potential contract signing on October 1st
- Retention incentives are in place with two milestones
- 11 of 12 employees have a transition plan in place



Project Status-Employees

Employee Success Team:

- Innovative process right mix of support at the table
- Protocol established for future
- Departments are engaged and supportive
 - 18 shadows departments hosted
- Staff has embraced the support and experience
- Opportunity for future growth has been realized

Economic Development & Tourism Department

- Phased implementation of transition plan
- Current Director of Tourism Term expiring September 30, 2024
- Rebranding of CVB to DMO is included in transition plan



SUMMARY



Summary

- Staff continues to recommend a private management model for the Waco Convention Center
- Staff continues to recommend maintaining the Visitors Bureau in house and create the Office of Economic Development and Tourism, consistent with State of Texas model
- Goals continue to be maximizing operational efficiency, increasing revenue, and enhancing the national profile of the Waco Convention Center
- During contract negotiations, continue to keep *employees* and *local* use of building at the top of negotiations



Next Steps

- Finalized contract negotiations anticipated by September 25, 2024
- Management contract tentatively scheduled for City Council consideration on October 1, 2024
- If Contract is approved by City Council:
 - October November transition period
 - December transition complete
