

Join Us for the Grand Opening of Penguin Shores

The City of Waco and Cameron Park Zoo are thrilled to announce the grand opening of the Gloria and F.M. Young Penguin Shores Exhibit on Thursday, August 8. The \$12.8 million state-of-the-art habitat will welcome the largest

colony of endangered South
African penguins in Texas.
Penguin Shores features a
pool and rock structure for
the penguins, an exhibit area for
black-footed cats, canopies,
a shaded plaza, and South
African-inspired murals.

Standing between 24 and 28 inches tall and weighing from 4.9 and 11 pounds,

African black-footed penguins are adorned with distinctive black stripes and spots on their chest. Monogamous by nature, these penguins display remarkable parental dedication. Both male and female take turns incubating their eggs until hatched, and one parent remains vigilant over the chicks for about a month before they join other chicks.

These charming creatures are classified as endangered, and without immediate intervention, could go extinct by 2035. Cameron Park Zoo, with the help of the Association of Zoos & Aquariums, is providing a safe haven for the penguins and hoping to inspire conservation efforts through awareness, solidarity, and education.

Cans, Cardboard, and Community: Waco Recycling Stats

Thank You for Making Waco a Cleaner and Greener Community!

Thanks to your recycling efforts, Waco has recycled 1,466 tons of material from January to May 2024 alone. That's a significant contribution to keeping our city clean and green! Here's what your recycling power translates to in real-world terms:



4,396 cubic yards of space saved in our landfills. That's enough space to fill over three and a half football fields.

15,139 trees saved reducing the need to cut down more trees.

24,970 gallons of oil saved from using recycled material rather than creating new products from scratch with crude oil.

RECYCLABLES

- #1 Plastics (clear plastics, including water and soda bottles, and some food packaging)
- #2 Plastics (more opaque plastics, including milk jugs, detergent bottles, cosmetics, or household cleaner bottles)
- Mixed Paper (newspaper, junk mail, phone books, and magazines)
- Clean Cardboard
- Aluminum, tin, and cans

DO NOT RECYCLE

- Plastic Bags
- Glass Bottles Milk/Juice Cartons
- Stvrofoam
- Aluminum Foil
- Textiles (clothes)
- Food Waste
- Greasy cardboard

HOW CAN I RECYCLE?

- Toss loose, unbagged recyclables in your blue cart.
- Blue recycling carts are collected every other week on your collection day.

University Parks Drive Now Reopened

Construction on Foster Pavilion Continues

After nearly four years of construction, University Parks Drive from Interstate 35 to Jackson Ave. has been reopened. The newly constructed road serves as a gateway for visitors and residents to the downtown and riverfront areas. Over 260 residential units, 16,000 square feet of retail space, 400 public parking spaces, and Baylor University's Foster Pavilion basketball arena have made their home in Downtown Waco.

Keep in mind that even though University Parks Drive is reopened, the riverfront development is still ongoing. A few ongoing projects will continue to result in closures. However, the entire road will not be closed for these updates.

Lake Waco Wetlands

Celebrates 20th **Anniversary**



Located on the North Bosque River and covering over 180 acres, the Lake Waco Wetlands provides a diverse habitat for the early development of plants and animals. They also provide protection from flood waters and naturally treat about 11 million gallons of water a day from the Bosque River.

The Wetlands were created to replenish habitats that were lost after Waco City Council authorized raising Lake Waco's water level in December 2000. Over the next few years, the nursery area was constructed and educational and research programs started. Later, on August 27, 2004, the Research & Education Center was opened.

Twenty years later, the Wetlands remain a valuable open-air educational area available for guided tours and exploration. To learn more, visit lakewacowetlands.org.
