Join us from 10 a.m. to 12 p.m. on Sunday, October 13 at Brazos Park East (3516 N Martin Luther King, Jr Blvd) for a FREE microchip and pet vaccination event! While supplies last. All pets of City of Waco residents can receive free microchips, rabies vaccines (if your animal is spayed/neutered), and DAPP (distemper adenovirus parvo parainfluenza) vaccinations.

If your animal is NOT spayed or neutered, vaccines and microchips will cost \$10. For McLennan County residents outside of Waco city limits, rabies vaccinations will cost \$10 regardless of spay/ neuter status. National Fire Prevention Week: Oct 6-12 Smoke Alarms: Make Them Work for You

Most of us don't realize that we have just two minutes to escape a home fire. Roughly two-thirds of residential fire deaths occur in homes with no smoke alarms or non-working smoke alarms, primarily due to missing or expired batteries. This year, make smoke alarms work for you!

Through the Home Fire Campaign, the Waco Fire Department, in partnership with the American Red Cross, will help install free smoke alarms and teach residents about home fire safety. Since the program started in 2014, the Red Cross and local partners like the Waco Fire Department have installed over 2.5 million smoke alarms and helped more than 1 million households become safer from home fires.
