

## Amendment to the 2024 Waco Comprehensive Safety Action Plan

The following amendments have been made to the Waco CSAP to incorporate additional supporting documentation, expand the scope of analysis, and include new planning initiatives and safety projects. These amendments were reviewed and approved by the Waco MPO Policy Board on June 6, 2024.

The comprehensive list of original CRIS categories and their respective new grouped categories is provided in Appendix L."
